6/15/- 17/21 – Dan Snyder attended TSI driver training at the annual WYTRANS conference held in Thermopolis and is our newest substitute driver.

6/16-17/21 – Randy and Cheri attended WYTRANS conference seminars in Thermopolis.

6/16/21 – Randy had a WYTRANS board meeting @ 6:30 pm, with Cheri and Dan in attendance. The WYDDOT Transit section met with WYTRANS board and finalized the 2022 budget awards for the transit providers. The 2022 budget will be effective starting Oct. 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.
