He has been trapping salamanders, they are up to 153 to date.

The Park bathrooms were plugged on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. They had to close them for the weekend. He had the service line cleaned and jetted the main line.

They have sewer jetted the whole town to the lagoon.

He has repaired the hydraulic lines on the sewer jetter.


