Councilwoman Sweeney made a motion to go into executive session at 7:34 pm. Councilwoman Truman 2nd the motion. All were in favor.


Councilwoman Sweeney made a motion to come out of executive session at 8:06 pm. Councilman Dewitt 2nd the motion. All were in favor.
