Recycling:

Dan Rice of the Washakie County Conservation Dist. stated that he has reviewed the MOU and they have made a few changes. The Ten Sleep Landfill board said they would be willing to

contribute \$75 a month toward paying a driver to take the trailer to Buffalo. The WCCD will pay mileage and maint. on the trailer.

The WCCD is in possession of the recycle trailer. The brakes have been repaired. Dan will bring it back to Ten Sleep for the Recycle Drive on March 7th.

Councilman Beckley made a motion to sign the MOU and contribute \$75 per month toward a driver to take the trailer to Buffalo. Councilwoman Sweeney 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Justin Smith – Big Horn Basin Outdoor Recreation:

Justin was not present so Councilman Beckley made a motion to table the item. Councilwoman Sweeney 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

3rd Reading of Ordinance #220 (Fireworks-Permit for Public Display):

Town Attorney Kitchen read the title and description of Ord. #220. Councilwoman Truman made a motion to adopt Ord. #220 on 3rd reading. Councilman Holmes 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Liquor Licenses:

There were three liquor license renewal applications. Two for Retail liquor license from the Ten Sleep Saloon and Big Horn Bar, and one for a Bar and Grill license from the Sleepy Coyote. Councilman Beckley made a motion to accept the liquor license requests. Councilman Holmes 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Julie Petersen – Famers Market:

The vendors permit was presented to the council by Clerk/Treas. Hughes. There was no one present to answer council questions. Councilwoman Sweeney made a motion to table the permit. Councilman Beckley 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Aaron Anderson – Legacy Park:

Aaron requested the expansion of the waterline to serve four additional lots for a subdivision located directly East of Ten Sleep. Councilwoman Sweeney made a motion to provide water to the 4 proposed lots in Anderson Legacy Park. Councilman Beckley 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Cottonwood Street Project:

Councilman Beckley asked if letters had been sent to residents. Mayor Haggerty will check with Wenck. Dan Rice stated that the time frame of the road work will affect the ranchers that use the Stock drive in May and June. Mayor Haggerty will check on this and get notifications out to the ranchers.

Special request for information:

The Town received an e-mail regarding how we post town business. Town Attorney Kitchen stated that the State statute (15-1-110) requires posting. Since the town does not have a newspaper that is printed in our municipality, we are required to post in the town areas chosen by Mayor and Council.

Councilwoman Sweeney asked about the Ten Sleep Tribute being a town paper. Councilman Beckley stated that it is not an actual newspaper it is a community newsletter. Town Attorney Kitchen stated that the town is going above and beyond the requirements of the statutes.

Councilman Beckley made a motion per advice of legal counsel to continue posting as required by State Statute 15-1-110. Councilwoman Sweeney 2nd the motion. All were in favor.
